


Global network of Biosphere Reserves



- Biosphere reserves are 'global learning places for sustainable development'.
- Biosphere reserves are landscape scale initiatives with three main objectives.
 - 1. Conservation of biodiversity and cultural diversity.
 - 2. Economic development that is socio-culturally and environmentally sustainable.
 - 3. Logistic support, underpinning development through research, monitoring, education and training.
- Are nominated by National governments.
- Are designated under the MAB Programme by the Director-General of UNESCO.













A Biosphere Reserves' three main zones

Core Area
Buffer Zone
Transitional Area

<u>Core Areas</u>

It comprises a strictly protected zone that contributes to the conservation of landscapes, ecosystems, species and genetic variation.

<u>Buffer Zones</u>

It surrounds or adjoins the core area(s), and is used for activities compatible with sound ecological practices that can reinforce scientific research, monitoring, training and education.

<u>Transition Area</u>

The transition area is where communities foster socioculturally and ecologically sustainable economic and human activities.



- The NPC was registered in 2000 benefits include:
 - Does not pay income tax.

Environmental Education and Awareness:

Establishment of 2 x Swop Shops at Middelpos, Saldanha and Laingville, St. Helena.

- Nearly 50 children collect recyclable materials throughout the week.
- Once a week, the recyclables are brought to the swop shop.
- Up to 2 tons of recyclable waste is collected every week.
- All materials are weighed and children are given points to the value of their contribution.
- Points are accumulated and eventually swopped for items from the shop which covers everything from basic stationary and toys to a grand prize of a mountain bike up for grabs.
- All items from the stores are donated to the Swop Shop.

- Each successive project stretched over a 3-year period.
- Current project will end in March 2022 and is to the value of R1.5 million.
- Employs 72 people.
- 2 300 initial hectares cleared.
- 1025 of follow-up hectares maintained.

1. Eve's Trail

 - Guided 2.5 day cultural experience from Darling to Yzerfontein.

3. The Five Bay Trail

 2.5 day, 38 km coast hugging walk between the West Coast Fishing villages of Paternoster and Jacobsbaai across five scenic bays.

 Accommodation at 3-star lodge in Paternoster with transfers in the mornings and afternoons with insightful interactions with local folk over meals.

4. The Wheels of Time

- Day 1 "Mission to Modern" is a 45 km cycle from Mamre Mission Station to Darling. Finishing off with dinner and a show with Tannie Ivy or Tannie Evita.
- Day 2 "Fossil to Footprint" is a 40 km wilderness cycle through the West Coast National Park.
- Day 3 "Eve to San" is a 16 km cycle from Yzerfontein, along the coast to !Khwa ttu.
